ALBERT "AL" GANDY

RETIRED CHIEF INVESTIGATOR
STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE SECOND
JUDICIAL COURT

Retired Chief Investigator Albert "Al" Gandy was hired by the State Attorney's Office in 1969. In 1970 he took a leave of absence to perform Active Duty with the US Army. In 1972 he returned to the State Attorney, where he retired in 2017 with total of 48+ years serving this country, state, and circuit.

Gandy became Chief Investigator for the 2nd Circuit in 1996, a position he held until his retirement in 2017. From 1969 until 2017 Al Gandy worked under six elected State Attorney's. There have only been seven in the history of the 2nd Judicial Circuit. Al worked assignments in every county in the circuit, from arson to murder to large scale narcotics cases.

For nearly half a century, he was the epitome of a liaison between law enforcement and prosecutors. His ability to communicate was uncanny. Al Gandy was known by and worked with every local, state and federal agency in the 2nd Circuit and beyond. For over 20 years, Gandy was a linchpin in law enforcement. Gandy worked many high-profile cases throughout his career, but was willing to work on any case that came across his desk.
