She worked in various departments and went back to school in the evenings, and earned a master's degree. After 31 years of service, she retired from AT&T and began teaching. In 1989, she was hired by the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC), where she began a second career that would impact hundreds of lives. Under her leadership,
