Born and raised in Wakulla County, Undersheriff/Major T.W. Maurice Langston began his public service career in 1973 in Hendry County, Florida, after graduating from the Southwest Florida Police Academy. Maurice returned to work for Wakulla Sheriff David F. Harvey, dedicating 32 years to serving Wakulla's citizens.

During his tenure, Maurice worked as a Road Patrol Deputy Sheriff; he also served as a School Resource Officer, Detective, Jail Administrator, Law Enforcement and Administrative Major, and Undersheriff. He graduated from FDLE's Executive Institute and the FBI National Academy.
