

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

WILLIAM PASCOE MASTER SERGEANT FLORIDA HIGHWAY PATROL

Master Sergeant William Pascoe served as a member of the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) - Troop F / Bradenton / Auxiliary unit from March 1987 to July 1989. In 1989, he reported to the Florida Highway Patrol Academy as a member of the 83rd class. Upon graduation he was stationed to Troop F / Bradenton. Over the years, he has worked in various positions including Drug Interdiction, Corporal (Traffic Homicide Investigator), Road Sergeant, and Traffic Homicide Sergeant in different duty stations within Troop F.

After taking the THI Sergeant position, he attended numerous classes related to traffic homicide and death investigation and the General Instructors Course. In July of 2017 he transferred to Troop Q / Bradenton to take a newly created Florida Advanced Investigation & Reconstruction (FLAIR) Team 4 Sergeant position. In this position, he supervises 4 Corporals who conduct Traffic homicide investigations on complex and high-profile cases that require advanced reconstruction techniques. He also began assisting with teaching Basic Traffic Homicide and Advanced Traffic Crash Investigation classes. In September of 2018 he became a Certified Reconstructionist with the Florida Highway Patrol. He has continued to assist with the teaching of these classes and has taught these classes outside of the Florida Highway Patrol.

Master Sergeant Pascoe has been a member of the Manatee County Child Death Review Team since 2009. This organization reviews child deaths and finds ways they can be prevented by education, changing Florida Statues, changing policies or procedures. Pascoe married Nina Pascoe in February 1989, and they are still happily married. They have three sons Spencer, Sawyer and Samuel.
